

Student Code of Conduct

The aim of this Student Code of Conduct is to ensure that the College is a safe and pleasant place in which learning takes place, that the property and reputation of the College is protected and that students develop self-discipline and consideration for others.

This Code applies to all students regarding the conduct expected of them whilst at school, engaging in school related activities or representing the school.

Student Rights

Students at Fairbridge College have the right to:

- feel safe within the school.
- be treated fairly and with respect.
- have their voices heard.
- a learning environment that meets their individual needs.
- be proud of their achievements.

Student Responsibilities

<i>Academic Conduct</i>	Students will be honest and actively participate in class at all times.
<i>Attendance</i>	Students will be on time to their classes and remain at the College during the school day.
<i>Equity, Respect & Fairness</i>	Students will treat people with respect, without bullying, harassment or abuse.
<i>Care of Resources</i>	Students will take care of all College flora, fauna, buildings and equipment.
<i>College Reputation</i>	Students will show pride in their work as well as the College.
<i>Safety and Health</i>	Students will refrain from anything that endangers the health, safety or wellbeing of others including bringing weapons, drugs or alcohol to school.

Breaching the Code of Conduct

Behaviour inconsistent with the Student Code of Conduct may result in disciplinary action including (but not limited to) making up lost learning time, modified timetable, suspension or cancellation of enrolment. Students should appreciate that serious offences such as assault, theft, wilful damage and other unlawful activities are highly likely to attract an extended suspension or cancellation of enrolment.

Reporting Breaches

If a student is concerned about the health, safety and well-being of another student they should report this directly to a member of staff. Students are assured that, if reporting breaches to the Code of Conduct, their names will not be made public, unless required by law and they will not suffer any consequences by making a report.
